Abstracting Tips

Per the SEER Manual Appendix C: Coding Guidelines: **Breast**-Use the information from reports in the following priority order to code a subsite when there is conflicting information:

1. Operative report
2. Pathology report
3. Mammogram, ultrasound (ultrasound becoming more frequently used)
4. Physical examination

Per the SEER Manual Appendix C: Coding Guidelines: **Colon**-Use the information from reports in the following priority order to code the primary site when there is conflicting information:

Resected cases

1. Operative report with surgeon's description
2. Pathology report
3. Imaging

Polypectomy or excision without resection

1. Endoscopy report
2. Pathology report
