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ICRA Members,

Happy New Year! This is a friendly reminder that with the new year comes new rules, including reportability changes. STORE 2022, page 31 (PDF page 32) has nicely summarized the newly reportable histologies and changes to terms. Please be sure to pay close attention to the section at the bottom of the table on page 33 – there are some histology codes with a /2 behavior that are NOT reportable to CoC (even those discussed in the NAACCR Implementation webinar). While we haven't heard any state updates, the NAACCR implementation tables do show that NPCR is requiring one of the new histologies that CoC is not – 8210/2 Adenomatous polyp, high grade dysplasia (stomach and small intestines only). That means these cases will be reportable as non-analytic (class 34 or 36) to the state. You will find references below, but please reach out with any further questions!
